

More Terminal Attribute Programs moved from BACRES to BEA diskette

TERMINAL ATTRIBUTE PROGRAMS

The Global System Manager V8.0 Release Notice (MBSRV8.0) describes the removal of obsolete Terminal Attribute Programs (TAPs) from the P.\$UTAP library on the V8.0 BACRES distribution diskette. This change was due to space restrictions on the V8.0 BACRES.

In order to make room for larger nucleus libraries (for example, the IBM PC +J5 library has grown to accommodate drivers for the TCL PCC/16i and Superport products) we have been forced to move more TAPs from P.\$UTAP on BACRES to the BEA distribution diskette.

The P.\$UTAP library on BACRES now contains only the following TAPs for serial terminals:

\$.163	Wyse-50
\$.167	Wyse-60 (PC/AT keyboard)
\$.169	Wyse-60 (standard keyboard)
\$.19	Basic VT-100

Of course \$.0 (no cursor positioning) continues to be available for use to install GSM when none of the above are relevant.

The remaining TAPs for serial terminals are included in the P.\$UTAP library on the BEA diskette. Note that prior to this re-release of System Manager V8.0, the TAPs on the BEA diskette were held as stand-alone files.

In order to use any of the TAPs distributed on the BEA diskette it is necessary to use \$LIB to extract the relevant \$.nnn files to the SYSRES volume.

This change does not affect the machine-specific TAPs (e.g \$.509 and \$.519) which will continue to be distributed in the P.nnnnT library (where nnnn is the configuration code).

3½" DISKETTE FORMATS - A REMINDER

We would like to take this opportunity to remind resellers that the changes from low-capacity to high-capacity 3½" distribution diskettes as described in bulletin GT619 take place over the coming weekend. Resellers will start to notice Global software being delivered on fewer high-capacity diskettes from Thursday 2nd September.
